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Asian Cinevision Announces 46th Asian American International Film Festival Announces Award Winners



August 17, 2023, NEW YORK – Asian CineVision is excited to announce the award winners for the 46th Asian American International Film Festival (AAIFF).

Running from July 26 to August 6, in 12 exhilarating days, AAIFF celebrated storytelling from the Asian and Asian diaspora community with programming that included over 100 feature and short films. Together, the festival cultivated communal joy and forged lasting connections. In a hybrid format, this year's AAIFF featured in-person events and programming such as *Retrospectives in Dialogue, Centerpiece: Music Night Out!*, the third annual *Interactive Media Gallery*, and riveting Q&As panels with filmmakers. The latter half of the festival went online, making screenings even more accessible via video on demand (VOD).

The Emerging Director awards recognize first or second time feature film directors. The Emerging Director in Narrative went to Sebastien Tobler, director of THIS TIME, while the award for Emerging Director in Documentary went to Law Chen, director of STARRING JERRY AS HIMSELF.
